
# 1. Overview of JICA and JGSDF's Project

### (1) JICA's Technical Cooperation Project

Project for Capacity Development on Sustainable Road Maintenance and Management in Juba

Project Purpose: To enhance the road maintenance management capacity of government (MRB/MoPI) through establishment of a cycle of road maintenance and management (road inventory and inspection, maintenance/repair plan, and maintenance/repair work).

Project for rehabilitation of Juba na Bari community road

Main activity:

Rehabilitation of one of community roads in Juba (1.8km)

- EoJ, JGSDF, and JICA Office took their own responsibility in terms of project monitoring and management.


