

9. Requests from Parties for advice or assistance

In accordance with the relevant procedures, the Committee is expected to consider any requests from individual Parties for advice and assistance regarding the implementation of the Convention, as provided for under decision I/7, annex, paragraphs 13, 36 and 37 (a). In this context, the Committee is expected to consider request ACCC/A/2022/3, concerning Ukraine, with a view to completing the preparation of its draft advice or to finalizing and adopting its advice, as applicable.
