1. Adoption of the agenda

In accordance with rule 9 of its rules of procedure, the Committee on the Rights of the Child may revise the agenda and may, as appropriate, add, defer or delete items. Only urgent items may be added to the agenda.

The provisional agenda for the ninety-first session was prepared by the Secretary-General, in consultation with the Chair of the Committee, in accordance with rule 6 of the rules of procedure.

2. Organizational matters

The session will be held from 29 August to 23 September 2022. The first meeting of the session will be convened on Monday, 29 August, at 10 a.m. Geneva time at Palais Wilson.

In accordance with rule 39 of the rules of procedure, the meetings of the Committee will be held in public unless the Committee decides otherwise.

Under the present item, the Committee will consider its programme of work for the session, as well as any other matters concerning the performance of its functions under the Convention.

3. Submission of reports of States parties

Reports received

In addition to the reports scheduled for consideration at the ninety-first session and the report whose consideration has been deferred to a future session (see item 4 below), as well as the reports included in the provisional agenda for the previous session (CRC/C/90/1), the Secretary-General has received the following reports of States parties on the implementation of the Convention on the Rights of the Child:

Overdue reports

Under rule 71 of the rules of procedure, the Secretary-General is required to notify the Committee at each session of all cases of non-submission of reports. The full list of initial and periodic reports due under the Convention, the Optional Protocol on the involvement of children in armed conflict and the Optional Protocol on the sale of children, child prostitution and child pornography, is available from the treaty body database.¹

The consideration of the combined fifth and sixth periodic reports of Azerbaijan, which was scheduled to be considered at the ninety-first session, has been deferred to the ninety-second session.

5. Cooperation with other United Nations bodies, specialized agencies and other competent bodies

The Committee will continue its discussion on how its cooperation with various competent bodies could be further strengthened to enhance the promotion and protection of the rights of the child.

6. Methods of work of the Committee and treaty body strengthening process

The Committee will continue its discussion concerning the organization of its future work and the procedures to be followed in the consideration of reports of States parties and the follow-up to those reports. In particular, the Committee will discuss issues related to its methods of work, including how to address the backlog of reports received and pending consideration, and will continue its discussion on follow-up to the treaty body strengthening process and the 2020 review.

7. Activities of the Committee under the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on a communications procedure

The Committee will consider any communication and information it has received in relation to the Optional Protocol.

8. Day of general discussion

The Committee will review the methods of work concerning future days of general discussion.

9. General comments

The Committee will continue its work on a draft general comment dedicated to children's rights and the environment, with a special focus on climate change.

10. Future sessions

The Committee will consider any developments relating to the schedule of its future sessions.

11. Other matters

The Committee will discuss any other matters relating to the work of the Committee, as considered necessary.

On 16 September 2022, the Committee will hold its biennial meeting with the United Nations Children's Fund, which was postponed from May 2022.
