The Role of the National Border Management Strategies in CT context

Concept Note

I. Rationale and background

The effective border security and management is essential for preventing and countering the flow of suspected terrorists across land, air, and maritime borders, as well as the cross-border movement of licit and illicit cargo, including drugs, weapons, arms, and munitions that may be used for terrorist purposes.

Member States in recent years are enhancing the measures to strengthen border security, particularly in light of the evolving FTF phenomenon, but capacities in this area vary widely and gaps continue to exist in the terms of legislative, human and technical resources.

In response, UNOCT/UNCCT since 2019 via its flagship Border Security and Management Programme together with partner organizations directly support Member States and regional organizations in implementing the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy and relevant Security Council resolutions, such as 1373 (2001), 1540 (2004), 2178 (2014), 2309 (2016), 2396 (2017), and 2482 (2019) through the provision of tailored technical assistance on development of national BSM strategies and action plans inclusive of counter terrorism elements, implementation of border security and management good practices, inter-agency and cross-border cooperation and information sharing.
