

First WHO Global Meeting on Skin Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs)

27-31 March 2023

HYBRID

(PHYSICAL MEETING AT WHO HEADQUARTERS IN GENEVA AND ONLINE)

Background

The World Health Organization (WHO) has published a strategic framework for integrated control and management of skin-related neglected tropical diseases (skin NTDs) that identifies opportunities to integrate approaches for control and management, including common learning platforms, capacity-building for case detection and delivery of treatment. The framework, a companion document to the NTD road map 2021–2030, was formally launched during a WHO-hosted webinar on 8 June 2022.

The road map emphasizes three fundamental shifts (programmatic actions, cross-cutting approaches, country ownership) to guide implementation of NTD activities. Integration is one of the cross-cutting approaches and forms the basis of the skin NTD framework.

Skin diseases are the third most prevalent cause of illness and one of the top 10 causes of disability. They are also among the 10 most common causes of outpatient visits. Of the 20 NTDs, more than half present with skin manifestations (the so-called skin NTDs)² and are often associated with long-term disability, stigmatization and mental health problems. They all require similar detection through the examination of the skin, and case-management approaches that present opportunities for integration, which both increases cost–effectiveness and expands coverage.

Some countries have developed integrated plans to address skin NTDs with the support of partners. The research community has also embraced the skin NTD approach, and some are currently working on projects involving multiple diseases. WHO has developed a manual and an App in both Android and iOS to help primary health workers recognize and manage the skin NTDs and other common skin conditions.

The last physical meeting on skin NTDs was held in March 2019 in Geneva, Switzerland because of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic. The proposed meeting, on 27–31 March 2023, will be a hybrid one (physical and virtual). It will provide an opportunity to convene all skin NTD stakeholders to take stock of progress since the last meeting and to identify ways to collaborate in the implementation of the framework.
