- **To identify key strategies and initiatives** that leverage the right to development framework to combat racial discrimination effectively,
- to generate recommendations for future actions and areas of focus for the Working Group.

- actionable recommendations or guidelines for politicians, civil society organizations, and others to integrate the right to development perspective into their efforts to combat racial discrimination,
- A summary report on the panel discussion to the Human Rights Council.

Format:

The panel discussion will be limited to three hours. The presentations by the panellists will be followed by an interactive discussion and conclusions from the panellists. States or observers, national human rights institution and non-governmental organizations will have the opportunity to raise issues and to ask panellists questions.
