

CONCEPT NOTE

Global Behavioural Insights meeting of focal points from WHO Regional Offices Geneva, 10-12 July 2023

In 2019, as part of transformation, the Director General launched in Headquarters an initiative for the incubation of a behavioural insights (BI) function which culminated in the creation of a formal BI unit in 2022 with a cross-cutting technical assistance and coordination mandate.

The goal of the BI function is to improve health policies and programmes by creating demand for, awareness and expertise on behavioural sciences primarily among WHO technical staff (in headquarters, regional and country offices). By using more and better BI as part of its work, WHO has the potential of generating increased attention and investment on BI among its key constituents, namely policy makers in countries, civil society, partners in public health.

Since early 2020 the BI unit has prioritized support to and collaborations with Regional and Country offices systematically operating across the three levels of the organization. As part of that it has created an informal community of practice with representatives interested in the field of BI from all regional offices. The community of practice has been meeting informally but regularly for almost three years and the BI unit has systemically involved regional and country colleagues in the development of strategies, products and projects.

On 29 May 2023, the WHA76 adopted the *Behavioural Science for Better Health* resolution which urges Member States to acknowledge the role of behavioural science; to identify opportunities to use behavioural science for equitable and human-centered policies; to establish behavioral science functions and to allocate sustainable human and financial resources. The resolution also requests the Director General to mainstream behavioural science into the work of the organization, to allocate sufficient funding and human resources, and to compile and disseminate evidence among others.

The Behavioural Insights unit (BIU) in HQ is convening in Geneva from 10 to 12 July 2022 a strategic global meeting of focal points for Behavioural insights from regional offices with the following objectives:

- 1. to provide updates on BI strategies, projects/activities, results and related;
- 2. to align strategies, priorities and plans for 2023 and 2024 and identify areas for multilevel and multi-office collaborations;
- 3. to discuss the implementation of the WHA76 Behavioural Science for Better Health resolution;
- 4. to build technical capacity and share knowledge.

A memo was sent to all Regional Directors in April 2023 requesting the nomination of participants to the meeting. In addition to the focal points from the regional offices the meeting will be attended by a number of HQ health topic experts from across the three pillars and external experts.
