For people everywhere, the ability to influence and shape their futures is critical. To this end, international human rights law enshrines the right to participate in public affairs without discrimination. However, in practice, people of African descent continue to be marginalized and excluded from decision-making processes, including those that directly affect them—a reality inextricably linked to daily experiences of systemic racism in every area of life.

This high-level panel will bring visibility to a new guidance note on <u>How to effectively implement the</u> right to participate in public affairs: A spotlight on people of African descent; and highlight the specific challenges faced by people of African descent in this regard. Panellists will explore synergies between combating systemic racism against people of African descent and the importance of their meaningful, inclusive, and safe participation in public affairs.
