	In accordance with Financial Regulation 5.5 and Financial Rule 5.5.02, budgetary transfers have to be reported to the Commission. The Provisional Technical Secretariat (PTS) has issued an Information Paper on Final 2023 Budgetary Transfers in document

7. Consideration of financial and budgetary decisions (cont.)	(3) Scale of assessments for contributions of States Signatories for 2025
	The Commission approves annually the scale of assessments for the following year.
	The PTS has issued an Information Paper setting out the scale of assessments for the Commission for 2025 based on the United Nations scale of assessment adjusted to take into account differences in membership between the United Nations and the Commission (CTBT/PTS/INF.1697).
	WGA will consider recommending to the Commission that it approve the scale.
8. 2023 Report on human resources management and equal employment opportunities	The consolidated report of the PTS on human resources management, containing statistical information on the composition of the PTS staff, information related to recruitment, and on the implementation of the decision of the Commission on equal employment opportunities – women in the PTS for 2023 will be issued as CTBT/PTS/INF.1701.
	WGA may wish to consider the report and to make comments and recommendations, as appropriate.
9. Summary of internal audit activities in 2023	The report on internal audit activities undertaken in 2023 has been issued as <a href="CTBT/PTS/INF.1698">CTBT/PTS/INF.1698</a> . The report is intended to enhance transparency and provide detailed information on internal audit activities, in accordance with the Internal Audit Charter.
10. Legal procedures for dealing with alternative site locations and station names and codes	(1) Legal procedures for dealing with alternative site locations and station names and codes
	At its Tenth Session, the Commission adopted the legal procedures outlined in recommendation 1 of the Report of WGA to the Tenth Session of the Commission (CTBT/PC-10/1/Annex I, section 3.6 and CTBT/PC-10/1) for dealing with alternative site locations and station names and codes in Annex 1 to the Protocol to the Treaty and agreed that work on such stations can continue.
	The PTS maintains a provisional list of changes and corrections that should be made to Annex 1 to the Protocol (CTBT/PTS/INF.211/Rev.20). At its Sixty-First Session, the Preparatory Commission approved changes to coordinates, codes or names of four International Monitoring System (IMS) facilities (CTBT/PC-61/2, para. 25).

10. Legal procedures for dealing with alternative site locations and station names and codes (cont.)	(2) Procedure for changing responsibility for an International Monitoring System station from one State Signatory to another
	At its Twenty-Eighth Session, WGB considered a procedure for the changing of responsibility for an IMS station from one State Signatory to another (as contained in <a href="CTBT/WGB/TL-1/50/Rev.1">CTBT/WGB/TL-1/50/Rev.1</a> ). WGB also considered the legal aspects of such a move (as contained in <a href="CTBT/PTS/INF.866">CTBT/PTS/INF.866</a> ). WGB noted that the procedure was not a technical verification related issue and requested that the Commission consider the matter ( <a href="CTBT/PC-28/1/Annex II">CTBT/PC-28/1/Annex II</a> , paragraph 64).
	At its Twenty-Eighth Session, the Commission asked WGA to consider the matter at its Thirty-Second Session (CTBT/PC-28/1, paragraph 21).
	The Chairpersons of WGA and WGB prepared a joint informal paper on this matter for the Thirty-Fourth Session of WGA ( <u>CTBT/WGA-34/INF.5</u> ). The WGA Chairperson decided to consult further on the issue.
	At its Sixty-Third Session, WGA requested its Chairperson to continue consultations on this issue with interested delegations and report to WGA on the results thereof. It also decided to revert to this agenda item at its Sixty-Fifth Session.
11. Status of on-site inspection inspectors and inspection assistants	At its Thirty-Sixth Session, WGA took note of model arrangements for future inspectors and inspection assistants (CTBT/PTS/INF.1036) and decided to continue its consideration of the issue.
	WGA further considered the model arrangements at its Thirty-Seventh Session. WGB, at its Fortieth Session, discussed the issue and agreed on an adjusted version of the draft model exchange of letters ( <a href="CTBT/PTS/INF.1036/Amend.1">CTBT/PTS/INF.1036/Amend.1</a> ). WGA noted this at its Forty-Third Session and that there was a need to address additional issues, such as the method of payment and the level of the salary of inspectors and inspection assistants, the scope of health insurance and the extension of the liability period for damage to health.
	WGA at its Sixty-Third Session requested its Chairperson to continue with informal consultations on the model arrangements. It also decided to revert to this issue at its Sixty-Fifth Session.
12. Conclusion of cooperation agreements between the Preparatory Commission and other international organizations	This item has been included regularly in the WGA agenda since its Fifty-Second session. WGA considers any updates. At the present session, there are no proposed cooperation agreements for consideration by the WGA.

WGA asked the Russian Federation to continue its consultations on the draft proposal and decided that this item will be considered at the next session of WGA.
