

1. Adoption of the agenda

In accordance with the Commission's rules of procedure, the first item to be considered is the adoption of the agenda.

2. Monitoring of transport-related Sustainable Development Goals

As the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development moves slightly past its midpoint, continued stocktaking in the transport sector within the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) region remains essential. The Working Party will receive updates on the completion of the Sustainable Development Goal microsite, which tracks transport-related Sustainable Development Goal indicators. Member States and other relevant actors are invited to share their experiences and progress in monitoring these indicators and to discuss additional activities related to monitoring transport-related Sustainable Development Goals using an indicator-based approach. Furthermore, member States are encouraged to submit relevant national indicators for potential inclusion on the microsite.

3. The Inland Transport Committee Strategy on Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Inland Transport

The Working Party will receive updates on the progress of monitoring the key performance indicators assigned to it under the Inland Transport Committee Strategy on Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Inland Transport. The Working Party may also wish to discuss additional measures to enhance the monitoring of these key performance indicators.

4. Data collection, methodological development and harmonization of transport statistics

(a) Common Questionnaire

This agenda item will discuss the availability of data collected through the 2024 cycle of the Common Questionnaire. Additionally, the Working Party will be briefed on ongoing efforts to enhance response rates and improve data quality. A particular focus will be on the streamlining exercise conducted in consultation with member States, which resulted in the discontinuation of certain indicators and the introduction of new ones.

(b) Electric vehicle recharging infrastructure

The secretariat will provide an update on the results and findings of the 2024 data collection round on electric vehicle recharging infrastructure data. The Working Party will discuss ways to increase the number of participating countries and improve the data collection method to achieve a fully standardized dataset.

(c) Urban rail ridership

The Working Party will be updated on the latest urban rail public transport data collection across ECE member States, including key findings from the 2024 data collection round. The secretariat will present trends in ridership recovery and highlight challenges in data harmonization. Country interventions on national urban rail data collection experiences are welcome.

(d) NST 2007

The Working Party will be updated on the NST 2007 classification system, which standardizes the classification of goods transported by various modes of transport, the transition of its hosting responsibilities to the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, and its current status.

5. Innovation in transport statistics production

This agenda item provides an opportunity for member States to share their experiences in leveraging innovative data sources for the production of transport statistics. Ireland will present its innovative "Connectivity Tool" to the Working Party. In addition, the Working Party will receive an update on the activities and progress of the Informal Group of Experts on Connectivity Tool, established at its seventy-fifth session.

6. 2025 traffic censuses

The Secretariat will provide an update on the preparation of the 2025 UNECE traffic censuses. Member States are invited to share their experiences, which may be useful in improving methodologies, addressing data collection challenges, and fostering the exchange of good practices in the implementation of national traffic censuses.

7. Statistical activities of member States

This standing agenda item provides an opportunity for member States to share their ongoing and planned activities in the field of transport statistics. The Netherlands will present its recently launched official statistics on freight transport via pipelines, which addresses a gap in transport statistics. Other member States are welcome to present their current projects and future plans.

8. Dissemination of transport statistics by the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe

The Working Party will be informed about the new and innovative webpage for the publication "2023 Statistics of Road Traffic Accidents" and the release of "2024 Inland Transport Statistics". Additionally, the secretariat will provide an update on the enhanced dissemination of transport statistics through story blogs. The Working Party will also be updated on the Transport Data Common Initiative, in which ECE plays a key role. Short country interventions on their own dissemination strategies and products are welcome.
