EVENT OUTLINE

International Day Against Nuclear Tests was established by the UN General Assembly in 2009 by resolution 64/35, to be commemorated annually on August 29. This day marks both the closure of the Semipalatinsk test site in 1991 and the date of the first Soviet nuclear test conducted there in 1949. More than 460 nuclear tests were conducted above ground, underground, and in the atmosphere, releasing enormous amounts of radioactive material into the air, water, and soil. Around 1.5 million people in Kazakhstan were exposed to radioactive fallout during these atmospheric and underground tests.

Globally since nuclear weapons testing began on 16 July 1945, over 2,000 have taken place. Some of the world's over 60 nuclear test sites (see interactive map) continue to be contaminated.

The primary objective of this event is to highlight and discuss the profound and lasting health impacts of nuclear tests. It seeks to bring together experts, policymakers, and stakeholders to share knowledge, experiences, and strategies to mitigate the health consequences of nuclear testing. The event aims to build on the insightful discussions held during the side-event organized by IPPNW, which Kazakhstan co-sponsored, held on May 31, 2024, which focused on the effects of nuclear war on health.

This event underscores the ongoing commitment of Kazakhstan and IPPNW to advocate for a nuclear-free world and to address the critical health issues arising from nuclear tests. We look forward to your valuable participation and contributions to this significant dialogue.
