In April 2019, the IACG handed over its <u>report</u> to the Secretary-General of the United Nations. The report included recommendations in five areas: A) Accelerate progress in countries, B) Innovate to secure the future, C) Collaborate for more effective action, D) Invest for a sustainable response and E) Strengthen accountability and global governance. In the June 2019 report, <u>Follow-up to the political declaration of the high-level meeting of the General Assembly on antimicrobial resistance</u>, the Secretary-General invited the Tripartite Organizations (FAO, OIE and WHO) to work with Member States and a range of partners and stakeholders, including civil society and the private sector, to collaborate to implement the recommendations of the IACG.

Among other efforts to take forward these important recommendations, the Tripartite Organizations have sketched out proposed next steps of establishing IACG-recommended governance structures, in consultation with the Secretary-General's office. Please join us for a discussion of these recommended structures, with a focus on obtaining feedback that ensure that global governance structure on antimicrobial resistance attract widespread support and are aligned with the expectations of stakeholders. This discussion will cover a range of issues, including specific feedback on the proposed Terms of Reference for the One Health Global Leaders Group on Antimicrobial Resistance.
