## CONSULTANT and WHO STAFF orientation on MAF, What's New in TB, and ENGAGEMENT WITH GLOBAL FUND PROPOSAL DEVELOPMENT FOR THE NEXT FUNDING CYCLE 2020/2023.

Convener: World Health Organization, Global TB Program, in collaboration with the Global Fund.

CONTEXT: This meeting is being convenient in the context of the need to align and update the knowledge of Consultants and WHO Staff supporting the development of Global Fund proposal development. The Global fund will be renewing grants in 27 of 30 of high burden TB countries that make up over 85% of the Global Burden. This meeting will orientate Consultants and WHO staff who will be engaged in supporting high burden or other priority countries with writing their tuberculosis specific Global Fund grant applications during the next funding cycle. This type of orientation has occurred once before in Geneva during the 2013 funding cycle and was very well received. It will update the consultants and WHO staff on the implementation of the latest WHO guidelines, including operationalising the Multisectoral Accountability Framework, as well as Global Fund processes and procedures. Holding this meeting in Geneva will have the strategic advantage of easy access to Global Fund staff supporting the workshop and informal discussions between high burden Country teams and consultants who will support their countries.

## Objectives of the meeting:

By the end of the meeting the consultants will be able to:

- i) Facilitate a Multisectoral Accountability Framework development discussion at country level and advise on its inclusion in both country strategic plans, and Global fund application.
- ii) Advise and support countries in navigating the new Global Fund mechanisms including the applications for matched funding and making a full expression of demand through the Unfunded Quality Demand Register, grant negotiation and reprogramming as well as portfolio optimization.
- support the operationalising of the latest WHO guidelines linked to the implementation of the END TB STRATEGY and review the cost benefits for various diagnostic tools and screening algoriths, as well as treatment of Drug sensitive and resistant TB and contact tracing, with treatment for prevention. WHOs work on social determinants and Universal health coverage, with insight into TB catastrophic cost surveys as tools for action, and programme engagement with safety nets will also be explored.
- iv) Advise on setting country UNHLM and END TB STRATEGY targets, and making progress against these, through universal access to TB diagnosis, and roll out of treatment for prevention

We propose a 5 day consultant workshop in Geneva with 30 consultants: 15 WHO and regional staff acting as country consultants during the Global Fund proposal writing surge, and our 5 regional WHO advisors: ensuring in each region that we cover the 30 priority TB countries with consultant support for the next GF funding cycle. In addition around 15 partner representatives will be invited to attend this meeting.

Altogether some 65 participants.

Cost 30 consultants and 20 WHO staff will be fully supported by HQ
